January is Human Trafficking Prevention Month, highlighting the importance of preventing human trafficking and recognizing its intersection with other forms of violence and social issues. This training session provides an essential overview of human trafficking, equipping participants with the tools needed to identify, respond to, and prevent trafficking in their communities.
